



# From the Director's Desk



#### Dear Reader.

It gives me great joy to write this note for the third year in a row. When we prepared to release Pacta's first annual report in January 2023, I had no expectation of how the journey ahead of me would shape up. Even where I stand today, I don't know what is in store for me or Pacta in the coming years. But I feel a much greater sense of belonging and belief in Pacta's work than I have felt, ever before.

In the last year, Pacta has made long strides. Three things stand out, in particular:


- a. Our work in the societal implications of emerging technology and data practices is gradually finding a voice and shape of its own. As we continue to incubate and nurture the technology and data research vertical, we see ourselves embracing the power of emerging technologies, yet aware of associated trade-offs and co-benefits. Pacta's work on balancing the rights of gig workers on digital platforms, data rights of vulnerable groups like children and persons with disabilities has only begun.
- b. Pacta's conviction that knowledge and familiarity with the laws is key in shifting power has deepened. We are boldly committing to democratise legal knowledge and rights in jargon free and low stakes formats. One such initiative is Learning Spaces—Pacta's flagship program to make legal compliances for the social sector simple to understand and implement. Learning Spaces I and II were conducted in in-person and online formats to facilitate a fear-free embrace of laws such as FCRA, Income Tax, GST and Labour Laws. The positive response from our community has encouraged us to continue this pursuit.

c. Our research in disability has deepened our resolve to work on access to justice and disability rights through evidence-driven and data-informed narratives. From 2020 - 2024. we laid a solid foundation to build our research program on data and justice for persons with disabilities. This year, we experimented with fresh tools such as illustrated comics and postcards to spark discussions on the journey to embodying rights. We continued our datainformed insights on disability budgets and orders passed by the Chief Commissioner of Persons with Disability, and this time we used AI to conduct the research. Our work in disability is expected to grow multi-fold in 2025 and beyond.

In 2024, Pacta also made strides institutionally—we renovated the office space, which brought renewed energy and optimism to the team. We launched the Chitta Initiative for Research by Pacta as a charitable trust dedicated to the pursuit of research to close gaps in translation between the intention and implementation of the law and policy. We also formalised and structured teams and work plans, to equip us to apply ourselves more consciously in the coming year.

I feel great gratitude for the experiences and people that shaped me in 2024. I am also proud of how much Team Pacta has grown in work, and hopefully in humility. We are looking forward to doing more great work in 2025—reaching deeper with our roots, but also strengthening our branches. We commit to do our work with grace, kindness and sincerity. On that note, may 2025 bestow us with the best!

### Who we are

Pacta is a Bengalurubased law firm and think tank dedicated to reducing inequities by bridging the gaps between the intent and implementation of laws and policies.

# Our Vision: Making law and policies work for everyone

Pacta employs a three-pronged approach to achieve its vision:

- **1. Legal Consulting:** Strengthening NGOs' operations, strategies, and programs.
- 2. Policy Research: Generating actionable, localized, and interdisciplinary evidence to close gaps between laws and practice.
- 3. Capacity Building: Equipping changemakers with a better understanding of laws to improve their impact.

### The Conscious Extension: Chitta

Towards the vision of reduced inequities, Pacta began in 2017 with a service provisioning approach. We first provided legal services and gradually added research and capacity building services when commissioned by individual clients/ changemakers. Over the years, we observed that shifting perspectives of systems recurred as an imperative to achieve reduced inequities. We felt compelled to initiate the change and follow through, not just in the capacity of a service provider, but as a changemaker ourselves. And from this conscience, Chitta was born.

Chitta Initiative for Research by Pacta is a public charitable trust established in 2024 to bridge the gap between intent and implementation of law and policy, ensuring that laws work for everyone. Chitta serves as a crucible from which action to reduce inequities and serve justice emanates.

### 4. Pacta's Key Knowledge Resources

### <u>i. Mitigating Legal & Ethical Risks for Not-for-</u> <u>Profit Organizations in Use of Al - A Primer</u>

Pacta developed a primer on Artificial Intelligence (AI) to help nonprofits understand the potential, risks, and responsible use of AI in their operations and programs. Pacta launched this at the Dasra - Tech4Dev CTO Summit in Bengaluru . The primer highlights:

- Al Applications for NGOs: Practical insights into Al-driven tools like automation, predictive analytics, NLP (Natural Language Processing), and generative Al for improving program efficiency, impact evaluation, and resource optimization.
- Ethical and Legal Considerations:
   Addressing challenges like data privacy,
   bias, and misuse of Al while recommending
   mitigation strategies and compliance with
   emerging regulations.
- Actionable Guidance: Case studies and real-world examples to help NGOs adopt Al responsibly, ensuring alignment with their mission while enhancing their operational capacity.

#### ii. Compliance Calendar for NGOs

To ensure ongoing compliance with the complex regulatory landscape, Pacta developed a comprehensive Compliance Calendar for NGOs. This internal resource serves as a critical tool for proactively managing statutory deadlines, including tax filings, regulatory submissions, and internal audits.

### iii. Compendium on cases pertaining to street dogs for research project at University of Edinburgh

Pacta was engaged to analyze court cases involving stray dogs in India. Data was sourced from High Court websites, legal databases, news articles, and animal welfare reports. The study highlighted the judiciary's role in resolving legal challenges related to stray dogs and emphasized the need for humane management and robust regulatory frameworks to address these complex issues effectively.

### e. Capacity Building by Pacta

At Pacta, we are committed to strengthening the legal and compliance capabilities of organizations within the social sector through targeted capacity building initiatives.

Pacta conducted compliance audits and training sessions on rights awareness on topics such as Data Privacy, LGBTQIA+ rights, Anti-Sexual Harassment Laws, Disability Rights, Child Safety Rights for several grass roots organisations such as British Asian Trust, Children's Investment Fund Foundation, Humsafar, among others.



## In-Person Workshop – August 9 & 10, 2024, Bengaluru


- Held at the Bangalore International Centre (BIC), this session focused on critical topics such as FCRA, GST, and Labour Compliances.








Tracing the Budgetary Allocation for Disability Sector in India

Budgetary Trends over the years upto 2024-25





Enrolment (SRE) project in Tamil Nadu, utilizing a mixed-methods approach.


This project, spearheaded by the Directorate for the Welfare of the

enhance the accuracy and effectiveness of the SRE project.




